What to do when you see a huro?

Tell us your name! Sing a song! But please stand far away, we are shy.

What if you see a huro who is hurt?

Call an adult you trust! Like your teacher or your parents.
Ask them to call our friends at The Huro Programme.

But how do huros get hurt?

Some bad people hurt us with guns. Some lock us in their homes.
Some cut down our homes. Electric shock from electric wires also hurts us.

Come, make a huro promise!

I promise that I will always be a friend of the huros.
I will tell all my friends, that huros are our friends.
And just like the huros, I will take care of our Garo Hills.

Garo Hills - A range of hills in Meghalaya, India

Huro - Hoolock, a species of gibbons. Did you know? Huros are the only apes found in India!

Nono - A Garo word for Little sister

Chigring - A traditional string musical instrument See. page 3.

Kotip - A traditional headband worn by people of Garo See. page 3.

Techri - A rare flower that blooms only in Garo Hills.

It is also the largest flower in the world. Wow!

Simsang - Name of a river that runs in the Garo Hills. It starts from the Nokrek Range and flows into Bangladesh.

Mongma - An elephant in the Garo language

Pagipa - A Garo word for Father

Magipa - A Garo word for Mother

Ambi - A Garo word for Grandmother

Michu - A fried rice cooked by the garo people
