
Dear reader,

## INDIVIDUAL DONORS

Our 12A & 80G certifications enables our donors (Indian Citizens only) to get a 50% deduction on the donated amount to us. We also got the CSR-1 certificate, which further enables Veditum to accept donations and support via the CSR -Corporate Social Responsibility route within India.

In the Financial Year 2022-2023, we tried expanding the individual donor base for Veditum and were able to increase the number of individual donors for Veditum by about 50%. This is important for us as our work expands, allowing us to have some amount of fiscal freedom for exploring new ideas.





She presented her work as 'Stories from a walk - Explorations in gender and space: academic perspectives'.



## **INDIA SAND WATCH**


At Veditum, we've been learning through our walks along rivers and through collaborative work about challenges faced by our rivers.

While this is a single page update here, a large amount of our total effort in the year has gone towards this project. We can't wait to share more!








## **RIVERS OF LIFE, AZIM PREMJI UNIVERSITY**



Siddharth was invited as one of the speakers, where his talk was titled 'Securing the future of Indian Rivers'.




### AGAMI **PRIZE SHORTLIST**



## MINED TO DESTRUCTION

Sand is the second most exploited resource after water and the most mined material globally, as per the UN Environment Programme. Its extraction from riverbeds is often done without regard to the adverse impact on natural river ecology. In India, sand mining grew as a large and, in many cases, illegal industry after the rapid urbanisation brought on by the economic liberalisation in the 1990s. While the country has sand mining laws in place, a lack of proper implementation and monitoring means that the riverbeds are constantly threatened. **Pulaha Roy**, along with **Siddharth Agarwal** and **Kumar Anirvan**, researchers with Kolkata-based non-profit Veditum India Foundation's sand mining platform, analyses satellite images of rivers across India to highlight the massive scale of ecological degradation due to sand mining and the open violation of mining laws.

### MINED TO DESTRUCTION -DOWN TO EARTH MAGAZINE

Earlier in 2023, we started sharing our work on the India Sand Watch project with our partners, while exploring collaborations.

Our team collaborated with Pulaha Roy, a data journalist from Down To Earth magazine, to tell a story about sand mining in India.

Using signals emerging from the data already added to the India Sand Watch platform, a 5 page print spread highlighted the issue in states across the country. This article was then translated into Hindi as well.


## **RIVER WALKS, MUTUAL AID AND OPEN FUTURES**

### WITH INDIA RIVERS FORUM



This year's event was co-organised with Pune based Manthan Adhyayan Kendra.



### **BUDDHIJEEV STUDIOS**


We love the slow nature of our work (though it can be sometimes frustrating) and the slow 'impact' that it creates.

Shridhar Sudhir from Buddhijeev Studios had joined Siddharth for about 500kms on the walk along the Ganga and about 250kms on the walk along River Ken, both as part of our Moving Upstream project.

The practice of walking in the way we designed it, left a mark on Shridhar. This past year, he initiated an effort at his own studio, and called it Ghumakkadi. This was to be an experiment in slow travel - walking through rural Bihar.



We also received several compliments on being upfront and transparent with details about the job, especially the salary, and we intend to continue this practice in the coming times.


We finally hired Kumar Anirvan, who is working on the India Sand Watch project.


### MAPPING KOLKATA'S AUTO NETWORK

This year was an interesting and long pending foray for us into the space of public transportation.

With our intern Taha Mama, an architecture student, who joined us for a month, we initiated an exercise to map all of Kolkata's auto routes, write about them and make the data available in the public domain.

We're hoping that the visualisation and availability of this data will show the extent of Kolkata's shared auto network & push for more focus on public transportation in the city.




